

LANGHORNE BOROUGH COUNCIL WORK SESSION

April 25, 2022

A work session of Langhorne Borough Council was held in person in Council Chambers on Tuesday, April 25, 2022. Vice President Rich Mason called the session to order at 7:30 p.m. and invited those present to pledge allegiance to the flag.

Present were Vice President Mason and Councilpersons Kathleen Horwatt, Nancy Culleton, and Kristen Farry. Absent were President Paul Murdock and Councilpersons Scott Haldeman and Anthony Marfia.

The purpose of the work session was to discuss Vice President Mason's proposed draft of a letter to Representative Frank Farry, in response to Rep. Farry's recent email to Council President Murdock conveying concerns and questions about the way that Council has responded to PennDOT's RC3 plans.

Vice President Mason and Councilpersons Horwatt and Culleton felt it was important for Council to send a written response. Councilperson Farry felt that such a formal written response was unnecessary and that in some places the tone was inappropriate.

Changes were discussed that would improve the tone of the letter.

Vice President Mason agreed to edit the draft and share the revised letter with Council before its May 8 meeting, at which there will be a vote on whether to send it.

Public Comment: Fran Grous, 360 Greenridge Rd., Middletown Township, urged individuals to attend Middletown Township supervisors' meetings to express their opposition to PennDOT's RC3 partial cloverleaf plan.

Councilperson Horwatt hoped that Middletown Township and Langhorne Borough officials will collaborate in their opposition.

On motion by Councilperson Farry seconded by Councilperson Culleton, the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 p.m.
